

What is the Cost?

A service co-payment is determined based on a family's eligibility. There is a maximum co-payment amount established based upon household size and monthly income amount. The family is expected to pay the weekly co-payment or the cost of service, whichever is lower.

Eligibility must be determined by an application process through the Perry County Job & Family Service office.

Families may continue to receive benefits until their income exceeds the income eligibility guidelines.



2024 Income Eligibility Guidelines

Family Size	Monthly Income
2	\$2,384
3	\$3,005
4	\$3,625
5	\$4,248
6	\$4,868

You May Be Eligible If:

- ◆ You are a parent or guardian who has no other responsible adult in your home to provide child care while you are at work or in training.
- ◆ You meet the current income eligibility requirements.

Eligibility is determined by comparing your gross monthly income to a publicly funded child care income schedule.

Child Day Care Services in Perry County Provided by Job & Family Services

Services Available

Publicly funded child care services are available for children whose parent(s) or guardian(s) meet eligibility requirements.

Employment

Must meet income eligibility guidelines

Ohio Works First (OWF)

Receiving cash assistance

Transitional

Not receiving OWF and gross monthly income is less than 150% of the 2021 Federal Poverty level

Education and Training or LEAP

Participating in an activity which prepares the caretaker parent for paid employment and meets the eligibility guidelines.

Protective

Through the County Children Services Board

Home-Based Care

Full or part-time child care is available for up to six children at one time in Type B homes and up to 12 in the homes of Type A homes. Both are certified child care providers.

child providers are required to complete specified hours of training related to child care issues. Home visits are made by the county department of Job & Family Services to ensure that providers and their homes are maintaining health and safety standards. At least one visit per year will be made unannounced.

In-Home Aides

IHA provides care in the home of the child(ren) in care. IHAs are required to complete the same hours of training as Type B and A providers to become certified.

Center-Based Care

Publicly funded child care services are available in state licensed day care centers willing to contract with the Perry County Job & Family Services.

The child care centers are regularly monitored by the



State of Ohio regarding required health and safety standards.

Publicly funded child care services are also available in Type A home, licensed by the State of Ohio. These provide center-based care in an individual's home for up to twelve children at one time.
